Today's Readings

Isaiah 43:18-19, 21-22, 24b-25 2 Corinthians 1:18-22 Mark 2:1-12

Today's readings reflect on the God's great gift of forgiveness. Isaiah points toward the new deliverance God is bringing to the exiled people of Israel. In his letter to the Corinthians, Paul declares that all such promises of God find their ultimate "Yes!" in Jesus. In today's gospel, Jesus says "yes" to the paralyzed man, not only healing his physical disability, but forgiving his sins as well.

FR. TOM'S MESSAGE

As we approach Lent 2012 we are reminded that Jesus does heal. The paralytic in today's gospel gives us the example of divine healing. Jesus heals body and soul of the paralytic. Jesus heals us if we turn to him with contrite hearts and deep faith. This will happen for us during Lent 2012.
